MBC-A (501c3) Update

MBC Association Board of Directors report of the February 19, 2019 Board meeting.

The following events are scheduled for 2019:

- May (TBD) US Customs and Border Protection seminar
- June 4-5: Environmental Career Day, for 120 Monroe Schools 7th graders
- July 27: (Regatta) Kids Fishing Derby and "MBC 600" Kayak Race
- Oct 2: Maritime Trades Career Day for 30 Monroe Sr High School students

An interview and documentation process to update the roles and responsibilities of the non-profit's officers will begin at the June MBC-A Board meeting. A project has come to our attention which Fred Hoitash will investigate... how MBC and possibly other ILYA member clubs can become involved in the Community Foundations Great Lakes Water Initiative. Southeast Michigan is one of six

environmental "clusters", which activate and grow regional networks, advance water literacy broker new financing strategies, recruit new local donors, and build new programs around water (which are all within the mission of MBC-A). This initiative matches our current programs as well as several in the feasibility stage.

Discussion on fund raising and various uses of the funds for renovation, maintenance, and updating facilities in use by both MBC-A and MBC took place. Extensive discussion was held on the feasibility of the Fishing for Life (breast cancer survivors) and Elementary Fishing Club. Both are complex projects, with the engagement and integration of different groups, including the medical and psychological professions, charter boat captains, MBC boat captains, teachers and administrators, and volunteers along with funding and facilities. The appropriate groups for each project must be brought together for support as a part of proposals for funding, and it's difficult to make final plans until funding is approved. The board decided to move ahead with both projects with key milestones identified where the go/no go decisions will be made. As

a part of this discussion, the need for specific facilities was formulated.

FYI Tax Information. As tax time is in full swing, the IRS still allows a charitable contribution deduction for travel expenses incurred for a charity. Cards were sent to participants for Charity Poke for 2018 as your documentation. If anyone needs documentation for the projects, please contact Charlotte Neuhauser at cneuhauser@gmail.com.

Another point of interest, IRA owners must be age 70 ½ or older to make a tax-free charitable contribution. Those who meet the age requirement can transfer up to \$100,000 per year directly to an eligible charity (MBC-A), without paying income tax on the transaction. Charitable contributions can only be made from IRAs, not 401(k)s or similar types of retirement accounts. You may roll funds over from a 401(k) to an IRA if you want to make tax-free charitable contributions part of your retirement plan. You don't need to itemize your taxes in order to make an IRA charitable distribution. However, you cannot additionally claim a charitable contribution tax deduction on a charitable distribution from your IRA. An IRA charitable contribution also satisfies the annual minimum distribution requirement for your IRA. It's always wise to check with your financial planner or tax accountant on these more complicated issues.

Update on Environmental Issues. The U.S. Senate passed the Natural Resources Management Act on February 12, 2019, containing many outstanding priorities advocated by the Congressional Sportsmen's Foundation, on a bipartisan vote of 92-8. The comprehensive package of legislation includes numerous

provisions that will improve access for sports men and women and will provide resources for habitat conservation programs. It provides for permanent reauthorization of the Land and Water Conservation Fund with 3% or \$15 million of annual appropriations made available for the purpose of securing additional lands for hunting, fishing, recreational shooting, and other outdoor related activities without costing taxpayers. For anglers, this Act covers a long list of protections and challenges faced by fish and wildlife populations by protecting critical habitat. It will be sent on to the House of Representatives for passage and hopeful signage by the President. (Source: <http://senate.gov>)

be needed. I need helpers to bring cordless drills to screw down the planks. Please email me or text me if you can help.




