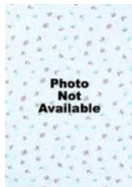
Dock Committee will be talking about dock improvements as we move forward. If you have any idea's or suggestions. Please feel free to contact myself or one of the committee members.

Your dock poles need to be removed by Midnight Friday November 13. If you re-rented a dock, you are responsible for removing the dock poles. If you offered your dock for re-rent and don't know whether it was re-rented, please call me. If the dock was not re-rented, the dock holder is responsible for pulling the dock poles. If you did an interseason switch with somebody, the dock you switched to is your responsibility. There is a \$50.00 per pole charge if the dock master has to pull your poles. Please secure your poles to the dock using plumbers strapping or any other appropriate material.

## MBC-A (501c3) Update

The Monroe Boat Club's 501c3 organization is called the MBC Association. By virtue of your club membership, all members and their significant others are Associates of the charitable organization. MBC-A funds, organizes and administers educational programs that have non-member, local schools and community involvement.

Due to the Covid health restrictions, all of the MBC-A programs for area school children were cancelled this year. However, the Trustees have continued planning and modifying the programs to suit the new conditions.

The springtime 2021 Environmental Career Day for 7th Graders has been awarded a \$3,000.00 grant from the Monroe County Environmental Fund. One of the highlights of the program is taking the students out on club members boats where the kids take water samples and later analyze them at our club. Due to the ongoing health concerns, this program might include some electronic teaching methods, but the on-the-water boat ride and water sample collections will continue to happen.

There has been continuing development on a new program designed for high school young women that will study Atmospherics and Weather. NOAA, the National Meteorology Society and area newscasters will be the primary instructors. We have partnered with the North Cape Sailing School to apply their knowledge thru practical experience on a sailboat. This program will be introduced in the Fall of 2021.

The next Auxiliary Meeting will be held on November 11 at 7:00 with the Board Meeting held just prior at 6:30. I hope to see lots of faces, new and seasoned, at the meeting. If you have been wanting to get more involved, these meetings are a great place to start.

Also under consideration is a "Fishing for Life" program that is aimed at helping breast cancer survivors heal and strengthen muscles that were damaged during surgery, as well as emotional support of their peers.

The MBC-Association has such confidence in the future that we have contracted with Monroe Boat Club and have pre-paid \$5,000.00 to rent future meeting space for these programs. The check was presented to Commodore Hoitash at the club's Annual Meeting on Oct 23.

Items of Interest**Results of Bylaw Change Proposals**

There were 7 Bylaw Change Proposals voted on October 14<sup>th</sup>. 86 absentee ballots were submitted, and 13 members voted in person, for a total of 99 members voting and 692 total votes cast. A two-thirds majority (66.667%) of the members voting is required to amend a Bylaw.

**#1** Proposes to reduce the current posting and approval process by requiring a minimum of 14 days of the application being posted before being inducted as a new member.

**75 FOR 24 Against PASSED with 75.75%**

**#2** Proposes extending the work hour deadline one month until October 1.

**73 FOR 26 Against PASSED with 73.73%**

**#3** Pro-rates new members' dues so there would not be a cost advantage regardless when a new member joins. Work Hours for new members would also be pro-rated by 1 hour per month from June to October.

**85 FOR 14 Against PASSED with 85.85%**

**#4** Requires new members to perform their work hour obligations but allow a first-year member to pay for un-completed hours.

**56 FOR 43 Against FAILED with 56.56 %**

**#5** Allow E-Mail to be used to deliver Membership Dues and E-Mail notification of club-wide voting meetings.

**75 FOR 23 Against PASSED with 76.53%**

**#6** Proposes to limit Life Members to 35% of regular dues-paying members. Life Members would not exceed 117. There will be no changes for individuals who are existing Life Members.

**77 FOR 22 Against PASSED with 77.78%**

**#7** Proposes that any Commodore receiving Life Membership would have a minimum of 10 continuous years of club membership with 3 years of service on the Board.

**85 FOR 14 Against PASSED with 85.85%**


### **MONROE BOAT CLUB 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary**


