# MBC-A (501c3) Update

The Club's 501c3 arm MBC Association has developed a group of educational programs that enable community youngsters to reinforce many of the skills that are essential to the "STEM/STEAM" educational curriculum.

Since the founding of our 501c3 in 2016, these programs have been independently funded with no money coming from the Club General MBC-A now provides 4 major projects: Environmental Career Day (for 7th graders), Maritime Trades Career Day (for High School), Kids Fishing Derby (during Regatta) and the Fishing Club for 5th/6th graders. In development is a county-wide Atmospherics and Weather Program geared for 10th grade high-school women to be rolled out in the Fall of 2021.

Every project MBC-A offers has goals and objectives which have been developed and approved in collaboration with the appropriate partners for each project. Beginning in 2007, an Agreement for Partnership between Monroe Boat Club, Monroe Public Schools, Lake Erie Environmental Outreach Program (LEEOP, which is now called Knabusch Math/Science Center), and Mason Consolidated Schools served as the foundation for our first funded project: "One Bag...One Boat Can Make A Difference" This was an initiative to clean up our waterways. We were awarded Boat US Foundation's 2007 Clean Water Grant of \$3,818.00. Bag sales and grant

For the duration of the COVID-19 situation, the need for the Recreation Passport for entry at state parks and other destinations is being waived.

Don't forget...your watercraft, unless exempt, must be registered with the Michigan Secretary of State. Registrations expire March 31 in the third year of issuance.

The Storage Yard Season is about to transition from Winter to Summer. If any MBC Members have boats stored with our neighboring marina partners (Trout's and Harbor Marine), and need temporary outdoor prep space, we can accommodate you at the rate of \$3.00/day per the Short-Term Storage Lot Fee section in the Roster.

Thank You to those Summer Storage customers who have already submitted their contracts, insurance and payments!! In the same way our club dues and dock fees are paid ahead, your Storage contract and fee needs to be turned in before you utilize the yard. You can store your empty trailer for the bargain rate of just \$45.00 and summer boat storage is just \$5.00/ft. Clear up your driveway and store at MBC!

Documents can be mailed to MBC or dropped into the slot in the wooden mailbox in the Commodore's Room (access via the door near the BBQ Pavilion).

The access gate is using the same lock and combination as before. When the lock is upgraded to the new key-card reader system, all paid-up customers will have their cards enabled to open the gate. There will be more information as that project moves forward.

Warmer weather is on its way and we are all looking forward to working on our boats. Please pick up any used containers, rags, etc. that are generated and dispose of materials properly. While you are getting ready for the boating season, continue to do your part to contain the spread of the virus so life can return to normal as soon as possible.
