INALLY, Spring is here, the ice is melting quickly, days are getting longer and boats will be docking soon. We have secured Monroe Plumbing and Heating to replace the current water system that was frozen and damaged. Work on the dock water supply system should be starting soon. We are hoping to have the job completed by mid May. The whole system will be replaced with galvanized steel piping. They will be installing drain and isolation valves that will make winterizing easier. During the first winterization of the system, MPH will provide direction in the proper winterization of the system.

MPH did a lot of research on the plastic piping and found it does not hold up well in direct sunlight. I plan on keeping the members informed on the progress of the work being done. If anyone has any questions regarding this matter, please feel free to contact me and I will address them.

Please watch the boards at the club for scheduled dock work parties in the near future and postings for re-rents of docks. I would like to thank Commodore Dave Ryan, P/C Brian Moyer, my dock committee and advisory board for their guidance, input and advice on this decision.


