Maritime Trades Career Day...Monroe Boat Club will be hosting 30 10-12th grade students from Monroe High

School in the back room on Tuesday, October 28. The idea for this project emerged from an article in the December, 2016, issue of Boat U.S. magazine which discussed the gap between supply and demand of maritime jobs, including ship and boat captains, diesel service technicians and mechanics, and small engine mechanics. We wondered if high school students enrolled in the trades courses had really considered maritime-related jobs? Consequently, discussions with the Monroe County Intermediate School District Director of Career and Technical Education and the Monroe High School Director of Career/Technical Education led to this project. The students will hear presentations from captains/commanding officers/owners of a charter fishing boat, a Great Lakes ship, the U.S. Coast Guard, the Michigan Industrial Boater's Association, the Monroe Port, and tours of a small engine repair facility, a large diesel engine repair facility, a dredging facility, and hopefully a U.S. Coast Guard boat. The focus of the day is three-pronged: Economy + Environment = Maritime Jobs. Attention those who have trained and/or worked in the trades... We need your help to make this an informative and fun day for the students. Three ways to help: (1) Easy Kitchen help to dispense pizza, fruit, cookies for lunch, (2) Join a table of kids for lunch and chat with them (share your work experiences, answer questions about jobs, regardless of whether they are maritime jobs, and (3) Walk with the students to Trout's Yacht Basin, talking with them, and walking back with them. The event will be held at the La-Z-Boy Center on November 18th, 2017 at 6:00pm. A poster will be at the Club with other details of the event. All proceeds from the "Fantasy of Trees" event will go to the cost of operating Paula's House. Three Hundred Thirty One women and over 80 children have been helped since Paula's House opened in 2004. Recovery for these women is a life-long process. Women typically stay between 6 and 15 months before moving into their own affordable housing. Paula's House provides a safe place for women and their children to live so they can work on their recovery and improving their lives. Many programs are offered at Paula's House and the women living at Paula's House pay 30% of their income toward their housing and are responsible for chore completion and performing community service.

I am chairing the silent auction for this event. Members and Board Members attending the Auxiliary meeting in September expressed a desire to make an International Basket of non-perishable items for the silent auction. I will have a large basket and a box at the Club on October 1st thru October 28th for your donation. I would like to thank the Auxiliary and the Satin Gavel for their kind donations.
