As a highlight of the day, MBC boaters take the students for a boat ride, and in the process, they collect Lake Erie water for quality analysis. We will be looking for 10 boaters who are willing to take 6 kids on their boats and share experiences with them as to their own careers and how they became boat owners. One of the objectives of the day is to share career information and encourage them to stay in school and work hard. We also need additional volunteers to help serve lunch and assist with the water testing. The water testing is simple with a list of instructions for the students, but each of the
